



Over the past 15 years, **Nigel Key** has produced an impressive body of work, including two string quartets, an opera premiered by the Nelson School of Music, a symphony workshopped by the Auckland Philharmonia and commissions for the Dunedin Sinfonia. "There was a time," writes William Dart, "when Nigel Key might have been considered one of the more cerebral of his generation. More recently, he has admitted a broader range of influences, particularly from the jazz world."
